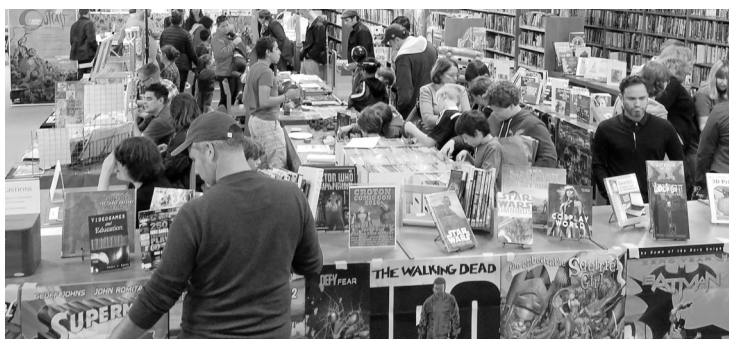

First Annual Croton Comic Con Incredibly Successful



On October 10, 2016 The Croton Free Library served as the venue for the first annual Croton Comic Con. First imagined as a way of bringing the type of celebration of comics, movies, games, and art made famous by conventions such as the New York Comic Con to the Village of Croton, the day-long event for the community welcomed all ages and served as a way for fans and talented individuals to gather and celebrate their shared interests.

The Library had an amazing turnout, with over 1,200 people in attendance over the course of the day. Attendees were able to peruse the tables set up in our Artist's Alley, featuring goods and displays set up by talented artists and creatives, and collectors of pop culture goods. Additional activities included a cosplay (aka costume play) contest, a costume-making workshop, gaming in the Teen Room, and a screening of the film X-Men: Apocalypse.

Special programs were held for younger attendees, such as a show by Chris Fuentes, The Balloonman; Bryan Lee, The Etch-A-Sketch Artist; and Cody Wells, The Legoman of New York. The event also served as a successful collaboration between the Library and local businesses, with 3rd Universe's Bryan Deyo being instrumental in the organizing of the event and Franki's Grill providing food and drink. The 501st Legion, an international, volunteer organization specializing in creating and displaying incredibly detailed Star Wars cosplay, made an appearance, making it an even more memorable day for all.

Given its success, The Croton Free Library is planning to make Croton Comic Con an annual event. Details on what we have planned for 2017 will be announced this summer.

Jesse holds a Bachelor of Art in Media Study with a concentration in Digital Art and a Master of Library Science, both from the State University of New York at Buffalo.

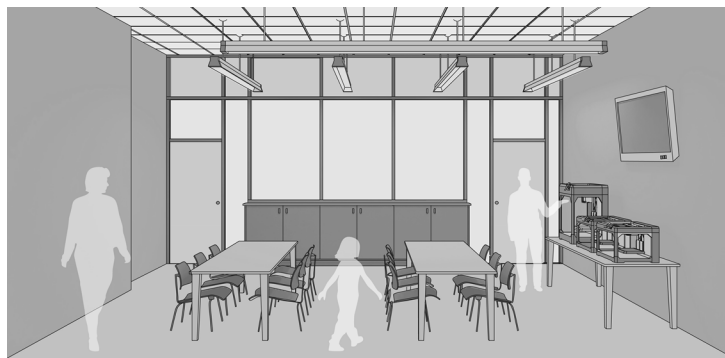
